

EARLY YEARS PUPIL PREMIUM

Planned Expenditure 2019-20

Early years pupil premium is an additional amount of funding that schools, pre-schools, nurseries and childminders will be able to claim for eligible 3 and 4 year old children to support their development and learning.

The Early Years Pupil Premium can provide up to an extra £302.60 a year for eligible pupils. Here at Oxhey Early Years we value every child and believe that children make progress through high levels of wellbeing, involvement and exploratory play. EYPP is used for targeted intervention to enhance teaching and learning within the setting and to close the attainment gap. This includes training our staff who are working in specialist areas such as speech and language or purchasing specialist resources to meet the needs of a child. We will use assessment to identify where a child may need additional support and consider resources/training accordingly. In the Autumn term we have identified 1 child who is in receipt of early years pupil premium funding.

How do parents apply?

All parents of 3-4 year olds will be given a form to complete at the beginning of each term. The office staff will use the information on the form to apply on line to find out if your child is eligible for EYPP.

<p>The interventions are monitored throughout the year. Progress and attainment is tracked through a comprehensive assessment process. Pupil progress meetings identifying all Data from each child’s Key Person, meetings with parents, the evidence in individual Learning Journeys (via Tapestry) as well as information from regular observations are used to measure the impact of the interventions.</p> <p>Expected Impact: All children accessing EYPP funding to make At least expected progress in CL, PSED and Literacy 80% to make better than expected progress in CL, PSED and Literacy.</p>
